- 1. The ambitious servant of God is driven to fulfill God's calling in her/her life by being fruitful, faithful, and focused.
- 2. Two significant principles stem from Romans 15:14-21: (a) Ministry is a gracious privilege—for all of us! and (b) The Gospel is a precious responsibility—for all of us!
- 3. Very soon, it will be "Time to meet your Mocha!" We must be ready!

What is God's ambition for you?

Paul gives us a holy ambition to shoot for:

- 1. Ambitious Servants Proclaim Christ.
- 2. Ambitious Servants Prioritize God's Calling.
- 3. Ambitions Servants Persist in Service to God.



We make our plans—and we ought to plan carefully for the future—but <u>our plans do not equal God's will</u>. The unexpected will come.

Six Certainties About Your Future:

A. Your plans—even made with well-ordered priorities—will change.

Romans 15:22, HCSB - ²² That is why I have been <u>prevented</u> [Gk: lit., hindered] many times from coming to you.

B. Your place in ministry will sometimes change.

Romans 15:23, HCSB - ²³ But now <u>I no longer have any work to do in these provinces</u>, and I have strongly desired for many years to come to you....

C. Your personal preference should be held lightly.

Romans 15:24, HCSB -²⁴ whenever I travel to Spain. For <u>I hope to see</u> you when I pass through, and to be assisted by you for my journey there, once I have first enjoyed your company for a while.

D. Your 'delays' may lead to greater blessings.

Romans 15:25–27, HCSB - ²⁵ <u>Right now I am traveling to Jerusalem to serve the saints</u>, ²⁶ for <u>Macedonia and Achaia were pleased to make a contribution for the poor among the saints in Jerusalem</u>. ²⁷ Yes, they were pleased, and indeed are indebted to them. For if the Gentiles have shared in their spiritual benefits, then they are obligated to minister to <u>Jews in material needs</u> <u>Josephus: ".... persecution...and drought"</u>].

A Word about Giving:

- They gave joyfully (v. 25)
- They gave in order to discharge a debt (v. 27a)
- They gave because of what they had in common (v. 27b)
- They gave to those in great need (v. 27c)

E. Your personal integrity must be guarded at all times.

Romans 15:28, HCSB - ²⁸ So when I have finished this and safely delivered the funds to them, I will visit you on the way to Spain.

F. God's purposes always prevail.

Romans 15:29, HCSB - ²⁹ I know that when I come to you, <u>I will come</u> in the fullness of the blessing of Christ.

Proverbs 16:9, NIV84 - 9 In his heart a man plans his course, <u>but the LORD determines his steps.</u>

Jeremiah 10:23, NIV84 - ²³ I know, O LORD, that <u>a man's life is not his own</u>; it is not for man to direct his steps.

Proverbs 19:21, NIV84 - ²¹ Many are the plans in a man's heart, <u>but it</u> <u>is the LORD's purpose that prevails.</u>
