See within the manger laid, Jesus, Lord of heaven and earth! Mary, Joseph, lend your aid, sing with us Messiah's birth..." - "Angel's We Have Heard on High, v. 4"

A. WHAT DO WE KNOW ABOUT JOSEPH?

- There are actually 16 different Josephs in Scripture. (e.g., Joseph in Gen. 4).
- The NT says remarkably little about Joseph—Mary's Husband & father of Jesus.
- He is never quoted in Scripture.
- He was born in Bethlehem, lived in Nazareth and was a carpenter by trade.
- Joseph and Mary would have to travel 95 miles in the dead of winter to register for the census that had been ordered by the Romans.
- He was most likely very poor and very young (i.e., probably around age 17 years.)
- He was in the blood line and linage of King David.
- He was faithful to Jewish customs and trained in their biblical teachings.
- Some scholars believe he died at an early age.
- He was "Pledged" (betrothed) to a young teenage named Mary. A sacred event, equal with marriage but without consummation. "It was a sacred test..."
- <u>Historically</u>: There were three stages of marriage in that day: (i) **Betrothal** (Heb: *kiddishin*) like engagement; (ii) **Ceremony** (Heb. *Huppah*) a private marriage ceremony; and iii. **Celebration** (Heb: *Huplau*) involved the honeymoon and public celebration.
- <u>Legally</u>: If unfaithful, Mary could have been stoned; Joseph would not even be allowed to marry her (cf., Deut. 22:20-21).

B. JOSEPH'S STORY

1. Joseph's _____

Matthew 1:18, NASB - ¹⁸ Now the birth of Jesus Christ was as follows: when His mother Mary had been betrothed to Joseph, before they came together <u>she was found to be with child</u> by the Holy Spirit.

2. Joseph's ______

Matthew 1:19, NASB - 19 And Joseph her husband, being a righteous man and not wanting to disgrace her, planned to send her away secretly.

3. Joseph's _____

Matthew 1:20–21, NASB - ²⁰ But when he had considered this, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife; for the Child who has been conceived in her is of the Holy Spirit. ²¹ "She will bear a Son; and you shall call His name Jesus, for He will save His people from their sins." ²³ "BEHOLD, THE VIRGIN SHALL BE WITH CHILD AND SHALL BEAR A SON, AND THEY SHALL CALL HIS NAME IMMANUEL," which translated means, "GOD WITH US."

4. Joseph's _____

Matthew 1:24–25, NASB - ²⁴ And Joseph awoke from his sleep and did as the angel of the Lord commanded him, and took Mary as his wife, ²⁵ but kept her a virgin until she gave birth to a Son; and he called His name Jesus.

C. WHAT DO WE LEARN FROM JOSEPH'S STORY?

We Learn What to do in Life's Toughest Times:

- 1. We must trust God's promises in the middle of doubts.
- 2. We must trust God's power in the middle of danger.
- 3. We must trust God's <u>plan</u> in the middle of <u>difficulty</u>.

Bonus: Like Joseph, let these three words characterize your life: Faith, Purity and Obedience.
